Free Styling & Spiraling

These improv-pieced spiral designs are sure to mesmerize and energize!! We'll start with square spirangles and experiment with different design options and construction techniques. Then we'll explore new spirangle designs: rectangles, triangles, hexagons, and diamonds...oh my!!

Materials/Supplies Needed:

- □ Fabric Requirements
 - 3/4 yard each of 2 contrasting fabrics
 - For more interest, you can add:
 - 4 or more coordinating fat quarters and/or half yard cuts
 - 2.5" strips from a jelly roll and/or 10" squares from a layer cake
 - Fabric Selections
 - Solids & small scale prints that read as solids will help your spiral designs pop!
 - Consider including 1 or more zinger fabrics: stripes, dots and/or ombres (especially ones that gradually change in color/value from selvedge to selvedge)
- $\hfill\square$ Sewing machine in good working order with $\ensuremath{\ensuremath{\mathcal{K}}}^{\prime\prime}$ piecing foot
- □ Neutral piecing thread
- □ Cutting supplies:
 - o rotary cutter
 - o cutting mat 18" or larger
 - o 12" square ruler
 - o 6" x 24" ruler
- Painter's tape (I highly recommend Scotch/3-M green painter's tape that is labeled for use with Brick, Concrete & Grout as it is tackier and sticks well to fabric)
- □ Iron & iron pad
- □ OPTIONAL:
 - o Small camera/camera phone/tablet
 - Maryellen's Best Press—Fragrance Free
 - $\circ \quad$ 12" or 13" rotating cutting mat
 - o 12.5" Creative Grid 60-degree Triangle
 - o 6" x 12" ruler
 - An extra mat, tray, or small design wall to hold cut pieces for assembly
